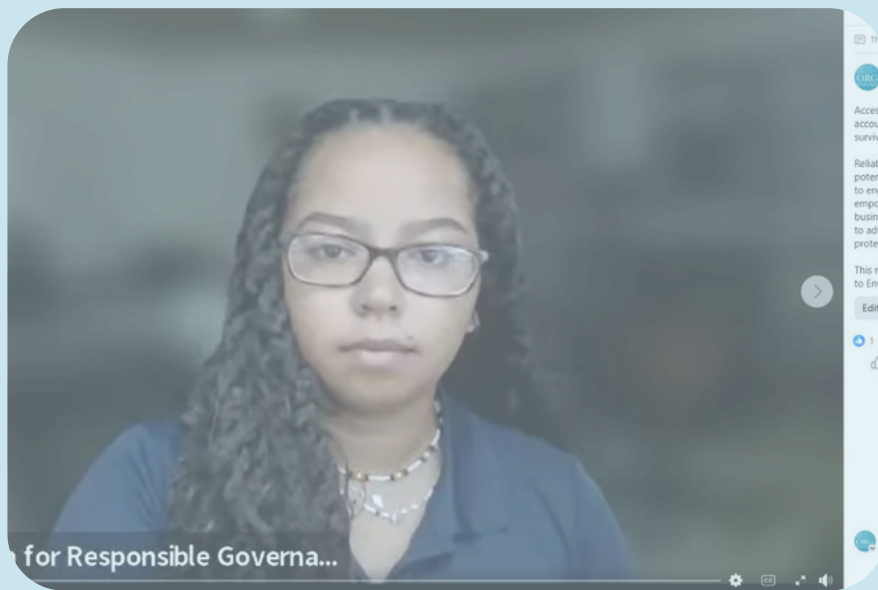

“If we had free access to information, we could determine which groups are disenfranchised or empowered by the laws and legislations that are on the books and by the decisions that are being made. You’d have information about what your resources are actually worth, how they may be impacted, and how that affects your bottom line as a human that uses the environment day-to-day. Making sure we can account for social, economic, and environmental sustainability hinges on us having good access to information.”
